•• Look at yourself! For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. Romans 3v23

Why is the world messed up? The Bible teaches that all have sinned – how does that make you feel? She will give birth to a son and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins. Matthew 1v21

Who will fix the problem of our sin? Throughout Old Testament times God promises to send a Saviour to deal with the problem of people's sin. As the New Testament begins, we learn that God's promised Rescuer is his Son, who is called Jesus – which means, "God saves". So, keep going!
